The Lake Region Senior Service, Inc. has been in existence since 2002. It is a non-profit, service corporation. It implements the Lake Region Senior Transportation Program. The Senior Transportation Programs are a pool of volunteer drivers, generally seniors themselves, using their own vehicles, who drive Senior and Disabled Citizens ithout other transportation alternatives) to and from medical appointments. Their drivers are vetted, compassionate and personable. Unfortunately they cannot provide wheelchair/van service. Clients must be able to transfer themselves in and out of vehicles with minimum "hands-on" assistance. They can accommodate clients with walkers or canes as long as they are generally ambulatory. They provide "through-the-door" service and will escort you to the place in the building where you need to be, and we will be there when your appointment has ended. Clients call the Program numbers and leave a message as to their need. The Dispatcher will check messages throughout the day and return the call for ride details and confirmation within 24 hours. They do not drive evenings, weekends, holidays or in unsafe weather. Phone hours are between Monday through Friday from 00am to 5:00pm.

The program uses volunteer drivers in their own cars, and the number of trips that can be scheduled is related to volunteer driver availability. The program is always looking for volunteer drivers (drivers are reimbursed for their vehicle use per mile based on a sliding scale which follows the price of gas). Average, workable notice of 2 weeks is generally required. They utilize a "Schedule of Suggested Donations" which are affordable and vary regarding average distances between residences and medical facilities.

Cumberland County, RTP will do its best to help you get where you need to go. Because RTP is a shared-ride service, it does require flexibility on the part of riders. No application required for "General Public" trips.
