Those wishing to join to make use of Independent Seniors Network complete simple applications, beginning with a phone call to 207-370-1896. Members pay an annual membership fee to Portland Area Villages. The fee covers a portion of the operating

expenses. Individual fees are \$275 and Household fees are \$350. Some scholarships are available for lower income members. Payment plans are also an option. Services must be requested 7-10 business days prior to the date of service. Please keep in mind that our office hours are 9:00-1:00 Monday through Friday. This will allow you time to identify and schedule a volunteer for you. Anyone age 60+ or disabled who lives in the Greater Portland area can become a member.

Notes: Anyone can take advantage of RTP county bus routes for shopping, hospital visits, city errands, a visit to the public library, or any other purpose. This is on a "space-available" basis. As long as the trip is taking place within Cumberland County, RTP will do its best to help you get where you need to go. Because RTP is a shared-ride service, it does require flexibility on the part of riders. No application required for "General Public" trips.

RTP also offers bus service in the Lake Region on a fixed route from Naples along Route 302 to downtown Portland. Please call for details and fares.

The General Public Fare is \$3. The Fare is \$5.00 each way for trips between non-adjointing towns.

For riders who are 60 or older and over income guidelines provided by DHHS, you will still qualify for our services. The fare is \$2.50 One-Way, for trips within one town, or between neighboring towns (increasing to \$3 effective April 1, 2024) and \$5.00 One-Way, for trips between non-adjointing towns. Here's an example; A trip from Portland to South Portland costs \$2.50 each way (before April 1, 2024), \$5.00 round-trip. A trip from Cumberland to Portland costs \$5.00 each way, \$10.00 round-trip.

For qualified riders, we schedule door-to-door rides so that you can get to your medical appointments. Appointments for those riders living in Portland, South Portland or Westbrook may be on a daily basis. When possible, make your appointments with your doctor between the hours of 10:00 am and 2:00 pm. If you live in another town, Call RTP dispatch to get the schedule of times/days available. Rides can be scheduled up to 14 day in advance, but no later than two business days prior to your appointment date.

The time restrictions do not apply for riders going to dialysis or cancer treatments.

If you have an appointment scheduled with your doctor which is outside of the times above, we will work with you whenever possible to make sure you are still able to get to the appointment.

Some riders will be required to pay a fare each way for transportation. When you call to schedule your ride, the Mobility Agent will let you know if a fare is due.

Some agencies, such as CDS, have contracted with RTP to provide rides for their clients to therapeutic day care services. If we have a contract with an outside agency, times and availability may be different that what is stated above. Please call for more information.
